Water and Sanitation

As basic human rights (United Nations 2010), clean water and sanitation are essential for preventing illness and death, and improving health, social and economic conditions. CanAssist supports access to clean water by working with communities to install boreholes and water catchment tanks, and has initiated irrigation systems needed to grow food. CanAssist supports sanitation by helping build latrines and other facilities, particularly in schools.

Education

A right under the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, and a social determinant of health, education is a key focus area for CanAssist funding through infrastructure projects. CanAssist has supported the building of classrooms, schools, support structures, teacher accommodation and sports pads, and has provided books, other basic school supplies, and furniture.

Health Care

CanAssist provides funding for health-related infrastructure projects that support hospitals and clinics, and improve quality of basic health care. Examples include providing hospital beds and water tanks, and funding building enhancements such as solar panels and security fencing.

2020 CanAssist African Relief Trust Project Manager's Report Good news in a Pandemic Year!

In January 2020, when we heard about a new virus spreading around the world, we were worried that it might impact our funding and work with CanAssist African Relief Trust. After a few slow months due to lockdowns, both at home and in Africa, we were pleased that donations came generously and projects were funded and completed in record time. Through ongoing support to infrastructure projects in East Africa we are helping communities help themselves and leaving a lasting impact. Your ongoing financial support means that we can continue to build schools, fund latrines and water catchment and provide essential support to medical clinics. Together, we CanAssist!

I am pleased to share that last year we funded over \$164,000 for life-saving infrastructure projects. These include 2 new classrooms, 4 school kitchens with fuel efficient wood burning stoves, 4 latrines at rural schools, 3 water catchment tanks and associated guttering, 3 borehole wells, 1 security fencing project, 1 Women's Empowerment Centre, an access road, new classroom furnishings and school books and a community sports pad.





This essential support in the areas of education, water, health and hygiene have benefitted hard working African communities when they most need it. Not only do the community members benefit directly from a new school or a new well, for example, but by utilizing local labour and materials, CanAssist provides economic support as well.

Can you imagine running a school or medical clinic without water? We can't! There is still need for new water projects, new schools, medical clinic support and basic hygiene. We hope to continue to provide support, and through your kindness, we will assist. Asante sana,
